

Chief's Monthly Report May 2023

The Police Department responded to a total of 2186 calls for service during May 2023.

The department filled a total of 21 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 762 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 112 physical arrests that included 125 misdemeanor charges and 61 felony charges.

The department currently has 5 probationary officers in the Field Training Program.

ERPD answered 5 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.

From implementation of the tag reader cameras in the middle of March until May 31, 1,095,624 scanned plates have been recorded.




CITY OF EAST RIDGE May 2023 TRAFFIC CRASHES









East Ridge Animal Control

Shelter Report May 2023

Animal Control responded to a total of 87 calls for service during May 2023.

There are currently 11 cats housed at the shelter and 0 on foster.

There are currently 23 dogs housed at the shelter and 3 on foster.

The department responded to 9 injured animals for transport to medical care.

The department responded to 8 dead animals.

8 feral animal was released to the wild.

8 traps were set for feral cats.

4 police assistance responses.

There were 6 cats adopted.

There were 10 dogs adopted.

The shelter responded to 1 call for service involving a beaver.



Summary of the Month's Activities May1 – May 31, 2023

Fire Operations

The Department responded to 224 calls for service in the month of May 2023.

Fire Administration

- Scheduling fire inspections for each shift. Both new and current businesses.
- Staff attended several public education events in the park this month. During this we
 provided education handouts, color books, home escape plans, and fire helmets to the
 children.
- Staff has completed all scheduling of the cancer physicals for all firefighters.
- We are still awaiting parts for both ladders.
- Staff worked with Police, and Hamilton County EMS to establish a command post for all emergencies at the Thrillville Fair.
- Staff sent a boat crew to assist other agencies at the annual Iron Man, located on the
 Tennessee River.
- Deputy Chief Albright and Chief Williams visited the Pierce Manufacturing plant in Appleton Wisconsin to see the progress on a new engine that is being built for our department. It has been pushed to August for delivery.
- Our department Chaplain attended the annual Fallen Firefighter Ceremony in Emmitsburg Maryland.
- Two of our members graduated from the Hamilton County Rookie School, Firefighter II class.

Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for May were:

- 1. Fire Service: SCBA Evolution, air consumption drill (2 hours minimum)
- 2. Firefighter Safety: Fire Service and Firefighter Safety, Essentials 7 Ch.1: (2 hours minimum)
- 3. Rescue: Air Tools, Equipment Familiarization, Use, and Maintenance (2 hours minimum)
- 4. Driver Training: District Review-Streets, Hydrants, and FDC Locations (2 hours minimum)
- 5. Driver Training: Apparatus placement, roadway scene safety (2 hours Minimum)
- 6. Fire Service: Communications, Essentials 7 Ch. 2 (2 hours minimum)
- 7. Rescue: Rescue Jacks, Equipment Familiarization, use, and Maintenance (2 hours minimum)
- 8. Fire Service: Building Construction, Essentials 7 Ch. 3 (2 hours minimum)
- 9. Hazardous Materials: Rescue and recovery (2 hours minimum)
- 10. EMS: Adult Cardiac Protocols (3 hours minimum)

Maintenance

- Continued Maintenance on both Ladder Trucks, Quint 2 having control board rebuilt for nozzle controls. Ladder 1 having both basket cylinders rebuilt.
- Car1 several recalls. Scheduled and parts have been ordered for repair.

- Obtained quotes to have the new trailer and the new Battalion Chiefs vehicle stiped and lettered.
- Watching all spending in the last months of the current budget.
- All shifts will be doing a heavy Spring cleaning at both stations.
