The Police Department responded to a total of 1,646 calls for service during January 2023.

The department filled a total of 34 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 586 citations were issued.

ERPD made at total of 81 physical arrests that included 112 misdemeanor charges and 36 felony charges.



Shelter Report February 2023

Animal Control responded to a total of 50 calls for service during February 2023.

There are currently 4 cats housed at the shelter and 7 on foster.

There are currently 16 dogs housed at the shelter and 9 on foster.

The department responded to 6 injured animals for transport to medical care.

The department responded to 9 dead animals.

1 feral animal was released to the wild.

3 traps were set for feral cats.

1 pig was recovered from a residence and transferred to a rescue.



Summary of the Month's Activities February 1 – February 28, 2023

Fire Operations

The Department responded to 202 calls for service in the month of February 2023.

Fire Administration

- Scheduling fire inspections for each shift. Both new and current businesses.
- Staff has been working on the upcoming Fire Department budget needs.
- Staff has been searching for the best options for our firefighters and the City related to the Barry Brady Act. This includes Cancer screening annually for all Career Firefighters.
- Staff has contacted the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg Maryland and successfully enrolled two of our officers in an Incident Command and Control Class.
- Scheduling for two upcoming public education events. One is a Kids Expo at Camp
 Jordan on April 22nd, and the other is Wrigley Mars at Camp Jordan on April 29th. Fire
 Department will provide equipment display and handout for fire safety.
- Staff attended a public event (Career Day) at East Ridge Elementary where firefighters interacted with students.

Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for February were:

- 4. Rescue: Rescue Jacks, Equipment Familiarization, Use, and Maintenance. (2 hours minimum)
- Driver Training: Aerial Set-up and Operation of Elevated Master Streams. (2 hours Minimum)
- Rescue: Technical Rescue Support and Vehicle Extrication Operations, Essentials 7 CH
 17. (2 hours minimum)
- 7. Driver: District Review-Streets, Hydrants, and FDC Locations. (2 hours minimum)
- 8. Fire Service: Foam Firefighting, Liquid Fires, and Gas Fires, Essentials 7 CH 18. (2 hours minimum)
- 9. Hazardous Materials; Toxicology. (2 hours minimum)
