

## Chief's Monthly Report June 2023

The Police Department responded to a total of 2174 calls for service during June 2023.

The department filled a total of 17 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 724 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 100 physical arrests that included 132 misdemeanor charges and 67 felony charges.

The department currently has 5 probationary officers in the Field Training Program, and one probationary officer in the police academy.

ERPD answered 10 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.




# CITY OF EAST RIDGE June 2023 TRAFFIC CRASHES









# **East Ridge Animal Control**

## Shelter Report June 2023

Animal Control responded to a total of 86 calls for service during June 2023.

There are currently 27 cats housed at the shelter and 24 on foster.

There are currently 22 dogs housed at the shelter and 6 on foster.

The department responded to 10 injured animals for transport to medical care.

The department responded to 3 dead animals.

4 feral animals were released to the wild.

4 traps were set for feral cats.

3 police assistance responses.

There were 2 cats adopted.

There were 8 dogs adopted.

The shelter responded to 1 call for service involving a chicken.



# Summary of the Month's Activities June 1 – June 30, 2023

## Fire Operations

The Department responded to 233 calls for service in the month of June 2023.

#### Fire Administration

- Staff has Scheduled fire inspections and training for each shift.
- Staff attended meetings with TDOT and other first responder agencies to discuss the plans for the phase II, and Phase III of I-75 and I-24.
- Staff met with Chattanooga Fire department to develop a response plan during the upcoming construction of I-75 and I-24.
- We are still awaiting parts for Quint 2 waterway. It is still usable at this time.
- We have been posting photos of our new engine that is in production by-weekly. It is
  on schedule to be complete in late August.
- Two of our members graduated from the Hamilton County Rookie School, Firefighter II class.
- Ladder 1 maintenance has been completed. Both basket cylinders have been rebuilt.
- We had three members attend a swift water class. (Swiftwater I)

## Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for June were:

- 1. Fire Service: SCBA Evolution, Air Consumption Drill. (2/hour minimum).
- 2. Fire Service: Fire Dynamics, Essentials 7 Ch 4. (2/hour minimum).
- 3. Rescue: Z-Rig Setup and Use. (2\hour minimum).
- 4. Driver Training: District Review-Streets, Hydrants, and FDC Locations. (2\hour minimum).
- 5. Driver Training: Pump Operations, Relay Pumping\Tender Operations. (2/hour minimum).
- 6. Fire Service: Firefighter PPE, Maintenance and Cleaning Essentials, 7 Ch 5. (2/hour minimum).
- 7. Rescue: Swift Water Rescue Techniques and Equipment Review. (2/hours minimum).
- 8. Fire Service: Portable Fire Extinguishers, Essentials 7 Ch 6. (2/hour minimum).
- 9. Hazardous Materials: Advance Skills Review. (2 hour/minimum).
- 10. EMS: Adult Medical Emergency Protocols, Pg. 14-20. (3 hour/minimum).
