

#### Monthly Report - November 2023

#### **Grant Project Updates:**

#### • TDOT PIN 120226 (McBrien Road Resurfacing)

City administration is awaiting approval from TDOT on project extension for this project. Contract expired 10/31/2023. Construction is set for Spring 2024.

#### TDOT PIN 131488 (John Ross Road Resurfacing)

TDOT submitted pavement design recommendations to Volkert Engineering 11/3/23. NEPA phase has been completed. City administration received NTP for Design phase from TDOT on 11/21/23. Plan review and invoice submittals will take place until the new year.

#### TDOT PIN 122000 (Multimodal)

Mayor and Council approved change order #3 on 10/26/2023. CO #3 allows the project to extend until June 2024. The City's administration team officially submitted CO #3 to TDOT on 10/31/2023 for approval. Pending contract extension approval from TDOT.

#### Violent Crime Intervention Fund Grant

Resolution No. 3471 set for 11/9/2023 was approved to purchase a van intended for a mobile command center and SWAT assistance. The van was purchased from CarMax Chattanooga in the amount of \$48,797.69. A resolution will be placed on the 12/11/23 agenda to approve a purchase from "GSA" (General Services Administration) for drone equipment, a laser scanner, and a night vision device.

#### Statewide School Resource Officer Endowment Grant

The City received the fully executed contract on 10/2/2023 from TN Department of Safety & Homeland Security. The City received the full endowment in the amount of \$300,000 on 10/11/2023. Chief Uselton is working with City administration to purchase equipment for the new School Resource Officers.

#### Local Parks & Recreation Fund Grant

City administration submitted a budget amendment on 10/3/2023 for an additional \$400,000 totaling \$1.2 million in funds. TDEC acknowledged the budget amendment was received on 10/13/2023. City staff will attend the check presentation scheduled for 12/8/2023 at Henry Horton State Park in Chapel Hill, TN.

#### Chief's Monthly Report November 2023

The Police Department responded to a total of 1957 calls for service during November 2023.

The department filled a total of 23 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 610 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 58 physical arrests that included 102 misdemeanor charges and 34 felony charges.

The department currently has 5 probationary officers in the Field Training Program, and 3 probationary officers preparing to attend the police academy.

ERPD answered 10 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.

ERPD hosted a fill a cruiser event in conjunction with Citizens' Police Academy Alumni, Local Coffee of East Ridge, and the East Ridge Food Pantry.

Due to continuing manpower issues, CID is still currently operating one (1) person down which has a slight impact on the cases being assigned overall. Detective Johnson has completed an introductory on-call rotation and is striving to learn more of what his new position entails.

# Fire Operations

The Department responded to 261 calls for service in the month of November 2023.

#### Fire Administration

- Staff had a department cookout to celebrate our 30 -year anniversary.
- Staff and council had a dedication plaque attached to Quint 2 for retired Fire Chief
   Eddie Phillips. This was to celebrate our 30-year anniversary.
- Duty crews have been going to all schools to complete fire prevention.
- Staff posted and held interviews for a Captain position. Lieutenant Thomas Finch was promoted to Captain. With Battalion Chief Billy Quintrell retiring, we started back filling with promotions.
- Staff posted and held interviews for a Lieutenant position.
- Staff worked on annual uniforms to be ordered.
- Staff has been working to schedule a time, date, and location for our Christmas party in December.
- Staff held interviews for a fire inspector. Bryan Dean has been promoted to fire
  inspector. Bryan attended the Alabama Fire Collage and received his certification as a
  Fire Inspector I, we then completed reciprocity through the State of Tennessee for him
  to be certified in Tennessee.
- Staff made notification to the State Fire Marshal's office of our new fire inspector.
- Staff worked on Christmas Parade assignments. We will establish a unified Command
   Post during this event.

- Driver Training: District Review-Streets, hydrants/FDC, and Pre-Plans/Inspections (2/hour minimum).
- 6. Driver Training: Pump Operations, relay pumping/Tender Operations. (2/hour minimum).
- 7. Fire Service: Communications, Essentials 7, Ch 2 (2/hours minimum).
- EMS: Policies, First Responder Protocol Manual, POLI-001 to POLI-005. (3 /hour minimum).
- 9. Fire Service: Building Construction, Essentials 7, Ch 3 (2 hour/minimum).
- 10. Hazardous Materials: PPE (2 hour/minimum).

One member attended a Fire Inspector I class and received his certification at the Alabama Fire Collage.
