

Monthly Report - October 2023

Grant Project Updates:

• TDOT PIN 120226 (McBrien Road Resurfacing)

City administration, Thompson Engineering, and Talley Construction hosted a pre-construction meeting on 10/16/2023 to go over details on the project. Construction is estimated to last 30 days and to be completed in spring 2024. City staff submitted required forms to TDOT to get a project extension for next spring. Contract expired 10/31/2023.

TDOT PIN 131488 (John Ross Road Resurfacing)

TDOT approved the NEPA document on 10/6/2023. Volkert Engineering submitted a budget breakdown to the City to verify numbers on the project prior to submitting it to TDOT for approval. Once the funds are obligated, the City will receive the Notice to Proceed "NTP" on the project.

• TDOT PIN 122000 (Multimodal)

Mayor and Council approved change order #3 on 10/26/2023. CO #3 allows the project to extend until June 2024. The City's administration team officially submitted CO #3 to TDOT on 10/31/2023 for approval. The contract extension will pushed

for approval by TDOT officials.

Violent Crime Intervention Fund Grant

Received FY24 reimbursement workbook and certification statement sheets on 10/1/2023. Assistant Chief Creel has begun obtaining quotes for equipment within the grant's scope. Resolution No. 3471 is on the agenda for 11/9/2023 to approve the purchase of a van intended for a mobile command center and SWAT assistance.

Statewide School Resource Officer Endowment Grant

The City received the fully executed contract on 10/2/2023 from TN Department of Safety & Homeland Security. The City received the full endowment in the amount of \$300,000 on 10/11/2023. Police Chief Uselton made the first purchase against the grant for electronic equipment for future School Resource Officers.

Local Parks & Recreation Fund Grant

City administration submitted budget amendment on 10/3/2023 for an additional \$400,000 totaling \$1.2 million in funds. TDEC acknowledged the budget amendment was received on 10/13/2023. Waiting for approval or denial of additional monies requested.

Chief's Monthly Report October 2023

The Police Department responded to a total of 1929 calls for service during October 2023.

The department filled a total of 17 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 540 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 76 physical arrests that included 103 misdemeanor charges and 40 felony charges.

The department currently has 2 probationary officers in the Field Training Program, and 4 probationary officers in the police academy.

ERPD answered 12 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.

ERPD submitted 225 pounds of drugs/medications for destruction after a drug take back held at Walgreen's Pharmacy.

ERAS responded to 113 calls for service.

There are 6 cats at the shelter and 33 cats in foster.

There are 16 dogs housed at the shelter and 3 in foster.

ERAS responded to 7 injured and/or sick animals.

ERAS responded to 12 dead animals and transported them to the shelter for disposal.

There were 3 feral cats released to the wild.

There were 3 feral cats captured.

ERAS responded to 4 police assistances.

There were 11 cat adoptions.

There were 9 dog adoptions and 8 home returns.



Summary of the Month's Activities October 1 – October 31, 2023

Fire Operations

The Department responded to 264 calls for service in the month of October 2023.

Fire Administration

- Staff has Scheduled fire inspections and training for each shift.
- Staff continues to receive updates on the work project of I 24 and I 75 construction.
- Duty crews have been going to all schools during fire prevention week and the following week as well.
- Staff continues to work on outdated equipment for surplus.
- Staff has been interviewing for Battalion Chief Billy Quintrell's position. He will be retiring November 1st. These interviews were posted internally and all applicants that applied were interviewed. Captain James Burkhart will be promoted to the rank of Battalion Chief.
- After the Battalion Chief promotion, we are currently posting for a Captain's position.
 This position will be filled in early November.
- Crews will be giving out candy to children on Halloween and also providing fire prevention material.
- Crews provided a medical standby during the River Rescue clean-up.
- Crews sent a boat crew to Chattanooga to assist on the river with an Iron Man event.
- Staff set up a booth at the Cities Fall Festival to display for fire prevention. We interacted with over 1000 children.
- Staff has been assisting with fire inspections of new businesses while a replacement for the fire marshal's office is selected. We have continued code requirements as mandated by the state of Tennessee and have continued to meet the needs of our new businesses without any delays.

Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for October were:

- Fire Service: SCBA Evolution, Air Consumption Drill. (2/hour minimum).
