

Grant Project Updates:

• TDOT PIN 120226 (McBrien Road Resurfacing)

TDOT submitted fully executed amendment 4 to City administration on 12/11/2023. Construction is set to begin March 1, 2024. Contract expires April 1, 2024.

TDOT PIN 131488 (John Ross Road Resurfacing)

City administration and Volkert Engineering submitted TDOT Form 5-3 checklist and preliminary plans to Local Programs Office 12/28/2023. The City is awaiting approval and recommendations from TDOT on preliminary plans.

• TDOT PIN 122000 (Multimodal)

TDOT approved amendment 8 (Change Order #3) for this project. The amendment was submitted to the Mayor and City Attorney for execution. Once all signatures are received, the final document will be sent to City administration extending the contract completion date to June 28, 2024.

• Violent Crime Intervention Fund Grant

City administration received final executed contract for FY24 VCIF grant 15/5/2023. Assistant Chief Creel has been purchasing approved items within the grant's scope and submitting invoices to the Economic & Community Development department. Development Administrator McAllister created a reimbursement packet for OCJP to reimburse VCIF related expenditures.

Statewide School Resource Officer Endowment Grant

Chief Uselton is working with City administration to purchase equipment for the new School Resource Officers. City administration is working to place recently hired personnel into local schools to serve at SROs.

• Local Parks & Recreation Fund Grant

City administration met with TDEC officials to begin the process of preliminary requirements prior to entering contract. Development Administrator McAllister and Parks and Recreation Director Skiles completed Title VI compliance, Environmental clearance, Land activity, and began creating a protected boundary map to submit to Recreational Resources Division for approval.

Chief's Monthly Report December 2023

The Police Department responded to a total of 2400 calls for service during December 2023.

The department filled a total of 14 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 746 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 79 physical arrests that included 130 misdemeanor charges and 42 felony charges.

The department currently has 5 probationary officers in the Field Training Program, and 4 probationary officers preparing to attend the police academy.

ERPD answered 5 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.

Planning and training for the implementation of our first SRO to begin in the High School on January 8, 2024.

CID NOTE: Within the past month, CID saw a reduction in the number of cases either requiring assignment, lacking solvability factors, or otherwise lacking investigative leads. As a result, CID was able to clear cases exceeding the overall number of assigned cases; this resulted in a perceived inflated clearance rate. CID has begun the utilization of CSU Investigator Davis within the on-call rotation; he has completed the requisite course in Basic Criminal Investigation and volunteered for the added duties. Detective Hawks, as part of the USMS Fugitive Task Force, has assisted in the apprehensions of individuals wanted for a variety of charges to include homicide(s), gun(s), and drug(s).

- Staff attended the annual Legislative breakfast and discussed upcoming items of concern for 2024.

- 5. Driver Training: District Review-Streets, Hydrants/FDC, and Pre-Plans/Inspection. (2/hour minimum).
- 6. Driver Training: Aerial Setup and Operation of elevated master streams (2/hour minimum).
- 7. Fire Service: Portable Fire Extinguishers, Essentials 7, Ch. 6 (2/hours minimum).
- 8. EMS: Policies, First Responder Protocol Manual, PROC-001 to PROC-010. (3/hour minimum).
- 9. Fire Service: Ropes and Knots, Essentials 7, Ch. 7. (2 hour/minimum).
- 10. Hazardous Materials: Decontamination (2 hour/minimum).

Summary of the Year's Activities 2023

Fire Operations

The Department responded to **2,784** calls for service in the year of 2023.

Fire Administration

- Staff surplus, bad condition vehicles, radios, turnout gear, air pack bottles, and furniture from the old station two.
- Crews conducted annual hydrant flowing twice this year. A total of 500 hydrant.
- Staff implemented a response plan during the construction project on Ringgold Rd. this helped to maintain response times.
- Staff scheduled and retained files for annual air pack, masks, member fit testing and pulmonary functions tests.
- Staff work to develop needs for budget involving operations, manpower, and equipment.
- Staff submitted our in-service training to the Fire Commission for approval.

- Staff developed training for all shifts each month. Staff also scheduled all training for State Fire academy, National Fire Academy, Hamilton County Rookie School, Tennessee Association of Rescue Squads, IAAI (International Association of Arson Investigators), Tennessee Inspectors Association, and other outside agencies that provide training for the fire service.
- Staff scheduled and assigned members for several Public Education events. These events are as follows: Chattanooga Track Club, Mars Wrigley employee event, Kids Quest, Library 50th anniversary, Depart 30 year anniversary cookout, Roller Derby, Thrillville Fair, East Ridge Police National Night Out, Chattanooga Iron Man, Optimist Club Fishing Rodeo, National Fallen Firefighter Ceremony at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg MD, Career Day at East Ridge Middle School, City of East Ridge Fall Festival, River Rescue Clean up, Christmas Parade, Fireworks standby at the Chattanooga Red Wolfs Stadium, and conducted fire prevention at all Elementary Schools and Daycares in East Ridge.

Training

 2 members attended a Fire Command Operations class at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg MD.

 Fire and Codes Academy.
- 2 members attended an advance firefighting class at the Tennessee Smokey Mountain Weekend.
- All members completed Title VI training required by the City of East Ridge
- All Fire Officers completed the Drug Free Workplace training required by the City of East Ridge
- 8 members attended TARS (Tennessee Association Of Rescue Squads) swift Water recertification
- 3 Investigators attended an IAAI (International Association of Arson Investigators) conference for recertification
- 2 Inspectors attended an Inspector Conference for recertification
- All members attended boat training operations class.

Total department estimated training on shifts – 5,292 hours

Total department estimated training at specialized schools or classes –

1,220 hours

Total of training hours for the entire department – Over 6,000 hours

Maintenance

- All vehicles PM (Preventive Maintenance) completed
- All small equipment PM completed
- All Fire Hose tested
- All repairs completed, except Quint 2. We are looking at options for the needed repairs. Due to its age parts are not available.
- All SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) tested and certified
- SCBA bottle Compressor fill station tested and certified

- Surplus those vehicles that have been replaced due to condition
- Completed annual ground ladder, aerial ladders, and engine pumps tested and certified.

Special Projects

- For our department and the City of East Ridge to be compliant for the Barry Brady Act all firefighters must be offered opportunity to be Cancer tested. Staff searched and located a company that would provide required testing for our firefighters at the lowest cost for the City of East Ridge.
- Scheduling all areas of training for the department and its members.
- Staff worked with Pierce to build a New Enforcer Fire Engine. This
 replaced a 2010 Rosenbauer Fire Engine. After its completion it
 was delivered, and the department conducted a wash down
 ceremony before placing it in service.
- Staff developed an inventory of needed equipment for the new Pierce Engine. It was ordered and received.
- Staff worked with the City Council to order an additional engine to replace a HME Fire Engine 2005 model.
- Staff budgeted and added another command truck. This is a Ford F150 4x4. The older truck will role down to use with pulling trailers, and equipment.
- Staff added a 14 ft Trailer to be used for fire prevention and special events.
- Staff worked on a grant to obtain computers for all first out apparatus. This would allow our department to budget for Mobile CAD. This system allows our department to communicate with

- dispatch, hydrant locations, apparatus locations, pre plans, and dispatch updated information from all agencies responding.
- Staff worked with Human Resources to post for new firefighter positions. Six new members were hired.
- Staff worked on posting for promotions within the department.
 Battalion Chief Billy Quintrell retired, and we had to fill his position. This caused several other promotions that were interviewed and promoted. A Captain and Lieutenant as well.
- Ordered and received new turnout gear that was budgeted and a set from an awarded grant.
- All department uniforms were designed, ordered, and received.
- Developed 10 additional Department SOP's. (Standard Operating Procedures)
- Developed a response plan with Chattanooga Fire Department during the I 75 and I 24 construction projects.
- Worked with City Staff and City Council to develop and approve the Bridge Retirement Plan for Fire and Police.
- Planned and completed a retirement ceremony for Battalion Chief Billy Quintrell.
- Planned and completed a 30-year dedication ceremony for retired Fire Chief Eddie Phillips.
- Planned a department cookout to celebrate our 30-year anniversary.
