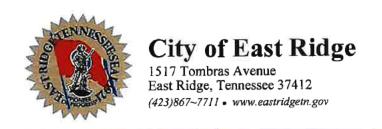

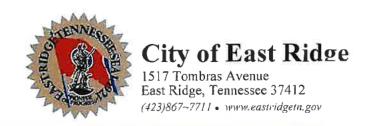

#### **Grant Project Updates:**

- TDOT PIN 120226 (McBrien Road Resurfacing)
   Construction is set to begin March 1, 2024. Contract expires April 1, 2024.
- TDOT PIN 131488 (John Ross Road Resurfacing)
   City Administration received comments back from TDOT on Preliminary Plans. Comments were addressed on behalf of the City by Volkert Engineering. ROW Plans were submitted to TDOT for review on 1/31/24.
- TDOT PIN 122000 (Multimodal)
   City Administration received fully executed amendment 8 extending the project completion date to June 30, 2024. The ECD department completed a single audit on PIN 122000 resulting in zero findings. Field work continues.
- Violent Crime Intervention Fund Grant
  The City has received most items purchased under the VCIF grant. Assistant Chief Creel and ECD Administrator
  McAllister met with the OCJP to discuss a potential budget amendment for items that are set to arrive after the end
  of FY24. A resolution was discovered and put in place. All items have been ordered.
- Statewide School Resource Officer Endowment Grant
   Chief Uselton is working with City administration to purchase equipment for the new School Resource Officers.
   City administration is working to place recently hired personnel into local schools to serve as SROs.
- Local Parks & Recreation Fund Grant
  City administration, ECD, and Parks and Recreation staff have worked to complete all tasks assigned in TDEC's
  GMS. HK Architects, Asa Engineering, and City staff met to discuss preliminary plans for the renovations at East
  Ridge Community Center. A meeting was set with TDEC officials to discuss the next steps in receiving a fully
  executed contract.

## Chief's Monthly Report January 2024

The Police Department responded to a total of 2238 calls for service during January 2024.

The department filled a total of 20 open records requests from citizens and the DA's office.

A total of 833 citations were issued.

ERPD made a total of 47 physical arrests that included 90 misdemeanor charges and 37 felony charges.

The department currently has 5 probationary officers in the Field Training Program, and 4 probationary officers attending the police academy.

ERPD answered 10 calls within the City of Ridgeside and conducted daily self-initiated (directed patrols, park and walks etc.) activities.

ERAS responded to 114 calls for service.

There are 7 cats at the shelter and 18 cats in foster.

There were 2 feral cats released to the wild.

There were 9 cat adoptions.

## Summary of the Month's Activities January 1 – January 31, 2024

## Fire Operations

The Department responded to 239 calls for service in the month of January 2024.

### Fire Administration

- Staff has Scheduled fire inspections and training for each shift.
- Staff continues to receive updates on the work project of I 24 and I 75 construction.
- Staff has been working on the upcoming budget needs. Budget forms have been given to all officers to receive feedback on department needs.
- Staff continues to work on outdated equipment for surplus. The 2010 Rosenbauer has been declared as surplus. Crews are currently removing all lettering and prepping it for sale at auction by Compass.
- Deputy Chief Albright is working on updating the Cities Occupational Health and Safety
   Plan. This will be presented to the council for approval once completed.
- Several fire officers attended NIMS class for 300 and 400.
- Staff attended a first responder agency with HCEMS.
- All members have been scheduled for their annual cancer screening and respiratory testing to be given by an off duty medical office.

## Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for January were:

- 1. Fire Service: SCBA Test Refresher Evaluation, review respiratory protection policy (2/hour minimum).
- 2. Fire Service: Ground Ladders, Essentials 7 Ch. 8. (2/hour minimum).
- 3. Rescue: Air Tools, Equipment Familiarization, use, and maintenance (2\hour minimum).
- 4. Firefighter Safety: Forcible Entry, Essentials 7 Ch. 9. (2\hour minimum).
- 5. Driver Training: District review-streets, hydrants/FDC, and Pre-plans/Inspections. (2/hour minimum).
- 6. Driver Training: Apparatus Placement, roadway scene safety (2/hour minimum).
- 7. Fire Service: Structural Search and Rescue, Essentials 7, Ch. 10 (2/hours minimum).
- EMS: Policies, First Responder Protocol Manual, PROT-001 to PROT-010 (3/hour minimum).
- 9. Fire Service: Tactical Ventilation, Essentials 7, Ch. 11. (2 hour/minimum).
- 10. Hazardous Materials: Toxicology (2 hour/minimum).
  - 6 Fire Officers attended a 300, 400 NIMS class at the HCEOC.

#### Maintenance
