

Monthly Report – April 2024

Grant Project Updates:

• TDOT PIN 120226 (McBrien Road Resurfacing)

Thompson Engineering and Talley Construction began construction on 3/11/2024, in the 1400 block of McBrien Road. Work was expected to be completed within (14) days; however, due to a few minor punch list items, the project was completed in (20) days. A contract extension request was submitted to TDOT Local Programs on 2/28/2024 for a 60-day extension – pending approval . A final inspection for PIN 120226 was scheduled for 4/10/2024. No punch list items were found to be corrected by TDOT. Thomspon Engineering is currently working on gathering all close-out documents. The City's ECD department is working to submit all final invoices for reimbursement.

TDOT PIN 131488 (John Ross Road Resurfacing)

City Administration and Volkert Engineering submitted final ROW plans on 3/5/2024. The City received the Notice to Proceed for the Right-of-Way phase on the subject project on 3/8/2024. Volkert Engineering submitted construction plans for review on 3/27/2024. City Administration and Volkert Engineering received ROW certification from TDOT Local Programs on 4/2/2024. Construction plans are still pending approval from TDOT Local Program's Office.

• TDOT PIN 122000 (Multimodal)

City Administration received fully executed amendment 8 extending the project completion date to June 30, 2024. TDOT Local Programs and the City's ECD department have completed submitting all invoices to the State for reimbursement. The City received the final reimbursement from TDOT Local Programs on 4/6/2024 on the subject project in the amount of \$630,753.16.

Violent Crime Intervention Fund Grant

City Administration and Assistant Chief Creel submitted the final reimbursement request to the State on 4/2/2024 in the amount of \$67,429.86. City Administration has begun the process of project close-out. In addition, Assistant Chief Creel and ECD Administrator are working on the required final reports due 7/31/2024.

• Statewide School Resource Officer Endowment Grant

Chief Uselton is working with City administration to purchase equipment for the new School Resource Officers. City administration is working to place recently hired personnel into local schools to serve as SROs. There are currently two officers in place under this program.

• Local Parks & Recreation Fund Grant

City Administration and Parks & Recreation staff reviewed and interviewed firms who submitted Statement of Qualifications on 4/29/2024. Staff's recommendation is to enter into a contract with Kimley Horn for Grant Administration and Design Services. Kimley Horn is currently working on creating a proposal contract to be presented to the Mayor and City Council for approval. In addition, Community Center Supervisor Spear has been working to create the required signage for the new building upon completion of renovations.







CITY OF EAST RIDGE April 2024 TRAFFIC CRASHES

April 2024 Monthly Report

ERAS responded to 124 calls for service.

There are 20 cats at the shelter and 5 cats in foster.

There are 26 dogs housed at the shelter and 1 in foster.

ERAS responded to 8 dead animals and transported them to the shelter for disposal.

There were 5 feral cat traps set.

ERAS responded to 6 police assistance calls.

There were 10 cat adoptions.

There were 11 dog adoptions.



Summary of the Month's Activities April 1 – April 30, 2024

Fire Operations

The Department responded to **279** calls for service in the month of April 2024.

Fire Administration

- Staff has Scheduled fire inspections and training for each shift.
- Staff conducted annual hydrant inspections.
- Staff working on events Emergency operations plans.
- The Rosenbauer Rescue Engine was auctioned by Compass. The city received its share after this sale for approximately \$47,000.00. This amount goes back into the general fund balance.
- Staff has been working with vendors that have upcoming events in the park, such as the Taco Festival, the Bacon Festival, the Apple Festival, and ANF (All or Nothing Fights). Fire Department will have crews establish a unified command post for the larger events to handle any incidents such as monitoring weather, medical needs, security needs, and any other potential hazards. Two of these events have been a success and we will continue learning the needs for other events as they come to Camp Jordan.
- Staff attended a tabletop disaster drill at the Chattanooga Airport. East Ridge is included due to the approach and takeoff from the airport.
- Staff organized a fire prevention display at the Kid Quest event inside the arena. A fire engine was on display for the kids as well as fire prevention education materials.
- Staff has scheduled a display at East Ridge High school for Career Day in May. As well as a standby during the fishing rodeo in May.
- Purchased 8 additional Thermal Imaging Cameras. These cameras provide more safety for the crews and help to locate fire or victims in less time.

Training

Each shift completes a minimum of two hours of training each shift normally. Training topics for April were:

- 1. Fire Service: SCBA Evolution, Large Area Search. (2\hour minimum).
- 2. Fire Service: Foam Fire Fighting, Liquid Fires, and Gas Fires, Essentials 7 Ch 18. (2/hour minimum).
- 3. Rescue: Z-Rig\Tension Diagonal. (2/hour minimum).
- 4. Fire Service: Incident Scene Operations, Essentials 7 Ch. 19. (2\hour minimum).
- 5. Driver Training: District Review-Streets, Hydrants\FDC, and Pre-Plans\Inspection. (2\hour minimum).
- 6. Driver Training: Pumps Operations, Relay pumping\Tender Operations. (2/hour minimum).
- 7. Fire Service: Fire Origin and Cause and Determination, Essentials 7 Ch. 20. (2/hour minimum).
- 8. EMS: First Responder Protocol Manual, PROT-025 to PROT-031. (2/hour minimum).
- 9. Fire Service: Maintenance and Testing Responsibilities, Essentials 7 Ch. 21 (2/ hour minimum).
- 10. Hazardous Materials: Product Control. (2/hour minimum).

We currently have two members in a First Responder Class at Highway 58 Fire Department and two members in the Hamilton County Firefighter II class.

Maintenance

- Repaired water line drains on Ladder One
- Repaired one SCBA (Air Packs)
- PM (Preventive Maintenance) was completed on small saws and hand tools
- Replaced the push mower at station one.
